and IHOS has also been nominated for a 2012 Australian Business and Arts foundation

The Helpmann Awards will be announced on Monday, 24 September at a gala event at

the Sydney Opera House. MONA FOMA, which commissioned The Barbarians, was

also nominated in the Best Contemporary Music Festivals category.
